Interesting Scout **Facts**

A comparative study of the records of Scouts and non-Scouts in a sampling of schools and colleges shows that Scouts hold most of the major positions of leadership in the student body. The survey resulted in the following statistics about school officers bearing a large amount of responsibility.

- * Of senior class presidents, 89% were Scouts.
- * Of junior class presidents, 80% were Scouts.
- * Of student council presidents, 85% were Scouts.
- * Of school newspaper editors, 88% were Scouts.
- * Of editors of school annuals, 77% were Scouts.
- * Of basketball captains, 64% were Scouts.

(And Cub Scouts may only shoot BB guns at approved Council or District events like Cubboree or Webelos Woods. So sign your pack up for Cubboree and Webelos Woods today!)

Amazon Jungle Stew

2 lbs. hamburger or 4 cups left-over meat

2 onions chopped

1 cup uncooked macaroni

1 cup water

3 (15 oz.) cans cooked kidney beans, drained

1 (1 lb. 3 oz) can crushed or diced tomatoes

1 jar (8oz) Mild Salsa

Brown onions and meat in a very skillet. (add oil if needed). Combine all ingredients and simmer for 30 minutes or until macaroni is tender.

Dutch Oven Tater-Tot Casserole

6 lbs of frozen Tater-Tot potatoes

2 cans of cream of chicken or mushroom soup

½ cup melted butter

1 large onion, chopped

1 cup sour cream

2 cups cheddar cheese, grated

1 can of diced green chilies

2 cups of diced ham (optional)



Grease a 12" Dutch oven with oil. Mix in potatoes and other ingredients inside the Dutch oven and bake approximately 50-60 minutes using 10-12 coals under the Dutch Oven and approximately 25 coals on top (approximately 400 F).

Vegetable Stir-Fry

- ? 1/2 bag porcini mushrooms, or 1/4 lb. fresh mushrooms, chopped
- ? 2 Tbs. lite soy sauce
- ? 1/4 cup vegetable stock
- ? 2 Tbs. fresh ginger, minced
- ? 3 cloves garlic, minced
- 2 1 lb. carrots, sliced
- ? 1 lb. tofu, thinly sliced
- ? 1 Tbs. vegetable oil
- ? 1 lb. snow peas
- ? 1 bunch scallions, cut into 1 inch pieces

Cover dried mushrooms with hot water. Let soak 15 minutes. Drain mushrooms through a sieve, reserving liquid. Rinse mushrooms and chop. Combine next 6 ingredients in a bowl and marinate 30 minutes. Heat oil in a heavy skillet or wok over medium-high heat. Add tofu mixture and stir-fry 3-4 minutes. Add remaining ingredients and reserved mushroom soaking liquid. Stir-fry 3-4 minutes or until carrots are tender.

Archery, Air Rifle shooting, Fly Fishing, and much more! Scouting Volunteers always needed.


We ask that no one bring their own personal hunting or fishing equipment to either event, please. All necessary equipment will be provided at the event.
