New! Merit Badges:

Requirement Changes and Booklet Price Change

Five Merit Badge booklets in the new series that came out in July have requirement changes - **Swimming, Drafting, Emergency Preparedness, Farm Mechanics**, and **Auto Mechanics** (which has been renamed **Automotive Maintenance**) with effective dates of 8/1/2008. In addition, the **Architecture** and **Landscape Architecture**

booklets have been combined into one booklet, but without any known changes to the badge requirements.

New Merit Badge booklets are now in color and cost \$4.49 per booklet.. however other

than the booklets mentioned above, the OLD booklets are still good, and BSA is selling them at \$2.49 each, while they last.

Pyromomma's Biscuits for Hungry Scouts

(So easy to make that a new Scout can make them) 1/2 cup butter, softened

3 ounces cream cheese softened 1 cup flour.

Preheat oven to 350 (or start coals for Dutch Oven) Mix butter and cheese until blended (you can use a Ziploc bag with the 'squish' method). Add the flour and "work" the mixture until a ball of dough forms. Lightly flour a smooth surface and roll the dough. Cut with a small biscuit cutter or roll in a ball and drop on the sheet or in the oven. Bake in 350 for 10-12 minutes or until biscuits are lightly browned. Makes 12 biscuits

Roundtable Variations from Pyromomma: Roll in cinnamon and sugar. Or how about adding grated cheddar cheese? Use dough to act as a cover for

sausage or pizza filling (like a calzone)
and bake in Dutch oven until center is
all melty. Use Adluh Sweet
Potato Biscuit Mix for Sweet
Potato Biscuits to go with
sausage links. Instead of rolling, they


can be cooked as drop biscuits.

Non-registered Boy means No Advancement and Un-Insured

Do you have Webelos that just crossed over to your troop? Is there a new Cub in your pack that will be going on the outing next week?

Many Scoutmasters and Cubmasters wait until they re-charter to register the new Scouts. This is dangerous for you and the boy.

If you have not registered them at the Scout office, either as a transfer from a pack or as a new Scout joining your troop or pack, the boy is not covered by BSA insurance if they go to meetings or camping. You May Be Personally Liable!!

Also boys who are not registered will be ineligible for rank advancement.

Do not wait.

Please check with Felicia at the Scout office to make sure that all gaps in registration are filled in.

Eagle Application News:



Changes for 2008
The new printing of the Eagle
Scout Rank Application, No. 58728, has a notable change. Now,
under Requirement 5, the name of the
candidate's Eagle project is required,
as well as the grand total of hours
devoted to it (from page 10 of the
Eagle Scout Leadership Project
Workbook). The new application

will be required beginning May 1, 2008.


Unit Commissioners are appointed by the district commissioner with the approval of the council executive board.
