Not Trained? No Tour Permit!

On January 1, Tour Permits will be issued only if new training standards are met. "Planning and Preparing for Hazardous Weather" is now

required for Tour Permits The new course to go with the new Tour Permit Requirements is now online at the Online Learning Center olc.scouting.org Remember! Don't wait until the last minute! Tour Permits must be submitted 2 weeks in advance. If plans change, updates can be made.

Important Note: if you file the Tour Permit late, it may not be returned to you in time for your trip. If you are camping without a signed and filed Tour Permit and an accident happens, you and your Chartered Organization may be liable for any injury, damage, or lawsuits resulting from your unit event. Please follow all guidelines and procedures to ensure a safe and enjoyable experience for your Cubs, Scouts, and Venturers. See Council "Smoke Signals" for details.

NewsFlash! All Unit Recharters are Due Now!

All Recharter dates have been moved to December and January. All recharters should be turned in ASAP no matter what month they are due!!! Every unit should have received their Charter Renewal packets in the mail. Our new Scout Executive wants things to move more smoothly in our council, so ALL units must recharter in either December or January, even if your unit does not normally recharter in those months. Scoutmasters and Boy Scout Leaders: Trainings in February

There will be a New Leader Essentials (NLE) Training and a Youth Protection Training given on Tuesday evening, February 17, 2009. This training is for Boy Scout, Varsity, Venture and Explorer Leaders. It is not for Cub Scout Leaders who now take New Leader Essentials Equivalent Training. It will take place at Faith Presbyterian Church in Ballentine, from 7:00 PM until 10:30 PM with check-in beginning at 6:45 PM. There will be a \$2.50 fee and a light supper will be served. Pre-registration is required. This can be accomplished online or at the Scout Service Center. The deadline for pre-registration is February 13, 2009.

Also there will be a Scoutmaster and Assistant Scoutmaster Leader Specific Training on Saturday, February 28, 2009.

It will be held at Faith Presbyterian Church from 8:00 AM until 4:30 PM with a check-in beginning at 7:45 AM. There is a \$15 fee which includes breakfast items and lunch. CPR: One, Two, Three, Four, Stayin' Alive


Properly performed, CPR can triple the chance that someone survives a heart attack, but even the best-trained Good Samaritans can have trouble finding the right rhythm and pace for the chest compressions. Unless, that is, they're disco fans.

A 15-doctor study found that teaching CPR to the tune of the Bee Gees' song "Stayin'

Alive" (the snappy anthem of the movie Saturday Night Fever) helped students perform the

compressions at the proper speed and pace on a test five weeks later

> The song is perfect for the rhythm needed. One Council's hospital nursing Ed dept. used to use it at their CPR Marathon Days. The



family thought the EMS provider, who was performing CPR on a family member, was being disrespectful of the dying person situation. He was either singing or humming "Staying Alive". Unfortunately the other song that works well and is used in courses is "Another One Bites The Dust". Who said disco was dead?

Pyromomma's Easy Scout Recipe

ENCHILADA PIE for Cold Weather Cooking!

- 2 lbs ground beef
- 1 med onion, chopped
- # 1 10¾ oz can tomato soup
- 2 10 oz cans mild enchilada sauce
- * 8 8-in. corn or flour tortillas
- 🐞 8 oz (2 cups) shredded cheddar, Jack or m

Brown the beef and onion in a Dutch oven. Drain off the fat. Add soup, enchilada sauce and 1 cup water. Simmer uncovered for 5 minutes. Spoon all but one-fourth of the mixture into a bowl. On top of the mixture remaining in the Dutch oven, arrange 2 tortillas. Layer one-third of the removed meat mixture, one-third of the cheese, and 2 tortillas. Repeat layers twice more. Cover. Simmer directly over hot coals for 7-10 minutes or until cheese is melted. Serves 8-10.

Non-registered Boy means

No Advancement <u>and</u> Un-Insured

Do you have Webelos that just crossed over to your troop? Is there a new Cub in your pack that will be going on the outing next week?

Many Scoutmasters and Cubmasters wait until they recharter to register the new Scouts. This is dangerous for you and the boy.

If you have not registered them at the Scout office, either



as a transfer from a pack or as a new Scout joining your troop or pack, the boy is not covered by BSA insurance if they go to meetings or camping. You May Be Personally Liable!!

Also boys who are not registered will be ineligible for rank advancement.

Do not wait.

Please check with Felicia at the Scout office to make sure that all gaps in registration are filled in.
