Next, take a look at the discussions in the Forums; these are public; anyone can join in. Dates are listed so you know when a post is new, and if you find a thread you're interested in, click the link to be emailed when someone responds—that way you won't miss a thing!

Finally, check out the **Groups**. We know it's not so easy to navigate groups right now. We have some categories, but they're fickle and you might find a group you like only after searching through all the "wrong" categories. We're working on that. But if you happen upon a group that interests you, just join the group if it's public, or request membership if it's private.

It has come to our attention that some Web sites, older publications, and instructions exist for a Webelos crossover or Boy Scout advancement ceremony that involves igniting a neckerchief dipped in a chemical fuel including acetone or alcohol mixed with water.

As stated in the <u>Guide to Safe Scouting</u> and the Boy Scouts of America Policy on the Use of Chemical Fuels: "The use of liquid fuels for starting any type of fire is prohibited."

Please help us protect the people, property, and environment of the Boy Scouts of America by adhering to this policy. Additional guidelines on the use of chemical fuels can be found in the *Guide to Safe Scouting* and on www.scouting.org.



Doing a Flag Ceremony?

Veterans can now



salute!

It is no longer necessary to be in uniform to render a salute! Veterans can now show their pride that they served!

As part of the Defense Authorization Act of 2009,

both veterans and active duty military not in uniform may render a salute to the National Anthem, flag ceremonies, and where appropriate. As our nation moves away from military service commitment to an all-volunteer military force, veterans can now show their pride that they served and have the distinction amongst civilians at any tribute to our country and flag.

The new provision improves upon a little known change in federal law last year that authorized veterans to render the military-style hand salute during the raising, lowering or passing of the flag, but it did not address salutes during the National Anthem. Effective January 28, 2008

New! Centennial Edition of the Boy Scout Handbook

The Centennial Edition (12th) of the Boy Scout Handbook

will be available in **July, 2009**. It will feature a mixture of parts of many of the early hand books with a 21st century flair. The handbook features chapters on Leadership and Leave No Trace, which both are firsts.

There will be a supplemental 100 year timeline book with the first printing, plus a mini-book with the rank requirements that is pocket-sized. A website will provide in-depth information on many subjects. The new handbook will be available in 5 different bindings (including a leather




bound version) and will be downloadable to an iPod (one of the reasons for the "electronics pocket" in the new scout shirt).

Oops! Not Trained? No Tour Permit For You!

As of January 1, 2009 Tour Permits will be issued only if new training standards are met. "Planning and Preparing for Hazardous Weather" is now required for all Tour Permits plus current Youth Protection Training as registered with the Council.



Remember! Don't wait until the last minute! Tour Permits must be submitted 2 weeks in

advance. If plans change, updates can be made. Important Note: if you file the Tour Permit late, it may not be returned to you in time for your trip. If you are camping without a signed and filed Tour Permit and an accident happens, you and your Chartered Organization may be liable for any injury, damage, or lawsuits resulting from your unit event. Please follow all guidelines, rules, and procedures given in training and at the national BSA site under Safety, read and take with you the Guide to Safe Scouting, and Be Prepared to ensure a safe and enjoyable experience for your Cubs, Scouts, and Venturers. 



Non-registered Boy means No Advancement and Un-Insured

Do you have Webelos that just crossed over to your troop? Is there a new Cub in your pack that will be going on the outing next week?

Many Scoutmasters and Cubmasters wait until they recharter to register the new Scouts. This is dangerous for you and the boy. If you have not registered them at the Scout office, either as a transfer from a pack or as a new Scout joining your troop or pack, the boy is not covered by BSA insurance if they go to meetings or camping. You May Be Personally Liable!! Also boys who are not registered will be ineligible for rank advancement.

Do not wait.

Please check with Felicia at the Scout office to make sure that all gaps in registration are filled in.
