Permits The new course to go with the new Tour Permit Requirements is now online at the Online Learning Center olc.scouting.org Remember! Don't wait until the last minute! Tour Permits must be submitted 2 weeks in advance. If plans change, updates can be made.

Important Note: if you file the Tour Permit late, it may not be returned to you in time for your trip. If you are camping without a signed and filed Tour Permit and an accident happens, you and your Chartered Organization may be liable for any injury, damage, or lawsuits resulting from your unit event. Scoutmasters and Boy Scout Leaders: Trainings in February




There will be a New Leader

It is not for Cub Scout Leaders who now take New Leader Essentials Equivalent Training. 
Notes from Tom:

Secret Good Deed Activity

This Activity is meant for Boy Scouts. Decide for yourself if it is appropriate for your younger scouts or not.

Put every Scout's name in a bag.

Each Scout in turn pulls out a name and memorizes it. When all are pulled out, put them all back in. Now, every Scout has the name of a Scout for whom he should do a good deed. When he completes his good deed, he reports what he did to the GameMaster (or Patrol Leader/Senior Patrol Leader/Crew Leader) and then picks another name. This continues all day or all week with the game leader keeping tally of good turns done. If the leader feels it was not an adequate good turn, he can tell the Scout to try again. Or if it was an exceptionally good turn the GameMaster can give extra credit. At the end of the event, add up all the credits for each patrol to determine the Good Deed Patrol.



Dash of salt


1 1/4 cup Tang/ Orange Instant Breakfast Drink 1/2 cup sugar 1/3 cup instant tea - unsweetened 3/4 teaspoon cinnamon 1/4 teaspoon cloves 1/4 tsp nutmeg



Mix together. Put 2 to 2 ¹/₂ teaspoon of mixture in cup and add boiling water over it. May be served cold with ice. Store in air-tight container. Note: This is very soothing for a sore throat or a cold.

Non-registered Boy means No Advancement and Un-Insured

Do you have Webelos that just crossed over to your troop? Is there a new Cub in your pack that will be going on the outing next week?

Many Scoutmasters and Cubmasters wait until they recharter to register the new Scouts. This is dangerous for you and the boy.

If you have not registered them at the Scout office, either



as a transfer from a pack or as a new Scout joining your troop or pack, the boy is not covered by BSA insurance if they go to meetings or camping. You May Be Personally Liable!! Also boys who are not registered will be ineligible for rank advancement. Do not wait.

Please check with Felicia at the Scout office to make sure that all gaps in registration are filled in.

Until you pay your fees online or in the Scout Shop you are not listed as registered. Credit card information can be taken over the phone or faxed and you don't even have to drive to the Scout Shop. **Don't forget!** Whether it is a Program or Training, your name will not be added onto the registration forms until payment is made. All the Soldiers involved in this effort are stationed in areas that are in harm's way. You send your support (letters and/or packages) addressed to them and when they see the "Attn: Any Soldier" line in their address they put your letters and packages into the hands of Soldiers who don't get much or any mail first. Everything is shared. We have volunteer Soldier "contacts" on the "Where to Send" page. Click through the names and select the one(s) you wish to support. They list what the folks they represent want and need. We even have a search capability so you can easily identify what the troops need most. "

Saturday, January 31 10 a.m. - noon Hampton-Preston Mansion 1615 Blanding Street Columbia, S.C. - Historic Columbia Foundation invites Boy Scouts and Girl Scouts to the historic Hampton-Preston Mansion for "Discovery at the Museum. The program is an opportunity for Scouts to earn a merit badge and learn about Columbia's significant past on Saturday, January 31 from 10 a.m. to noon at 1615 Blanding Street. During the day of discovery, troops will take a behind-thescenes tour at the Hampton-Preston Mansion, which is one of the preeminent 19th-century sites in South Carolina's capital city and home to many. Scouts will learn about museum standards for storage pieces such as textiles, ceramics, metals, wood, and paper. Visitors are encouraged to bring an object from home and learn the five steps of interpreting material culture. Admission is \$7 for children and \$4 for adults.
