There will be a supplemental 100 year timeline book with the first printing, plus a mini-book with the rank requirements that is pocketsized. A website will provide in-depth information on many subjects. The new handbook will be available in 5 different bindings (including a leather



bound version) and will be downloadable to an iPod (one of the reasons for the "electronics pocket" in the new scout shirt).



Doing a Flag Ceremony?

Veterans can now salute!



It is no longer necessary to be in uniform to render a salute! Veterans can now show their pride that they served!

As part of the Defense Authorization Act of 2009,

both veterans and active duty military not in uniform may render a salute to the National Anthem, flag ceremonies, and where appropriate. As our nation moves away from military service commitment to an all-volunteer military force, veterans can now show their pride that they served and have the distinction amongst civilians at any tribute to our country and flag.

The new provision improves upon a little known change in federal law last year that authorized veterans to render the military-style hand salute during the raising, lowering or passing of the flag, but it did not address salutes during the National Anthem. Effective January 28, 2008

Oops! Not Trained? No Tour Permit For You!

As of January 1, 2009 Tour Permits will be issued <u>only</u> if new training standards are met. "Planning and Preparing for Hazardous Weather" is now required for all Tour Permits plus current Youth Protection Training as registered with the Council.



The new courses to go with the new Tour Permit Requirements is now online at the Online Learning Center olc.scouting.org

Remember! Don't wait until the last minute! Tour Permits must be submitted 2 weeks in

advance. If plans change, updates can be made. Important Note: if you file the Tour Permit late, it may not be returned to you in time for your trip. If you are camping without a signed and filed Tour Permit and an accident happens, you and your Chartered Organization may be liable for any injury, damage, or lawsuits resulting from your unit event.

Please follow all guidelines, rules, and procedures given in training and at the national BSA site under **Safety**, read and take with you





Everything can index a fresh install of Windows XP SP2 (about 20,000 files) in about one second. Yet the index files it creates are a tiny 3MB to 5MB.

Pyromomma's Easy Scout Recipe

Neanderthal Roast

Cover Roast with yellow or brown prepared Mustard.

Pour Rock Salt on Roast to cover, or roll and press the rock salt into the roast, <u>completely covering all</u> surfaces. (The mustard will hold the Rock Salt on the meat). Put Roast on top of a thin layer of hot charcoal or hard wood coals. Cover the Roast with hot charcoal or wood for about an hour. Remove roast from coals



with shovel. Peel or chip the rock salt from the Roast and serve.

Required: A good supply of hardwood coals, a shovel, Mustard, Rock Salt, and a Roast

Non-registered Boy means No Advancement and Un-Insured

Do you have Webelos that just crossed over to your troop? Is there a new Cub in your pack that will be going on the outing next week?

Many Scoutmasters and Cubmasters wait until they recharter to register the new Scouts. This is dangerous for you and the boy.

If you have not registered them at the Scout office, either as a transfer from a pack or as a new Scout joining your



troop or pack, the boy is not covered by BSA insurance if they go to meetings or camping. You May Be Personally Liable!! Also boys who are not registered will be ineligible for rank advancement.

Do not wait.

Please check with Felicia at the Scout office to make sure that all gaps in registration are filled in.

A Webelos' Dilemma

Question: My son is a rising Webelos in his pack. He has earned the Arrow of Light but has not crossed over. Can he earn merit badges now? Can he be dual registered as both a Boy Scout and a Webelos?

Answer: A boy cannot be <u>both</u> a Boy Scout and a Cub Scout. Once he officially crosses over his Cub days are over. Likewise his Boy Scout days cannot start until the crossover. The official crossover point is NOT the crossover ceremony, but the date put on the transfer application to the troop (the ceremony



can take place months after his official crossover to the troop). As part of the Arrow of Light, the family needed to fill out an application to join a troop, but he does not (and probably should not) actually submit it to the troop at the time: if they process it right away you can run into problem submitting the Arrow of Light on a Cub advancement form (since once he is a Boy Scout he can no longer advance in Cubs, and thus can't earn the AOL after he becomes a Boy Scout).

Once the pack has submitted the advancement form for the Arrow of Light, and the boys have decided it is time to stop being a Cub and start becoming a Boy Scout, you can give the form to the troop or tell them it is ok to submit it. Normally you hold the crossover ceremony at this time, but that isn't strictly required. Note also, that giving the form isn't sufficient, but it must be accepted by the Scoutmaster for it to be official and filed at the Scout office. Once that step is taken he is officially a member of the troop and may advance and be covered by the unit insurance.

Also before he starts ANY merit badge, he must get a "blue card" from his Scoutmaster as permission to start that particular merit badge. Starting on a merit badge before you are a Boy Scout is a good way to make the badge not count.


