#### Is there a need for Scouting for Food this year? YES!!! Lets Beat Last Year's Record!

Last year, only 11 Cub Packs and 8 Boy Scout Troops participated in Scouting for Food, but they collected almost 10,000 pounds of food items. We currently have about 58 Packs and Troops in Etowah. If most of them helped with the Food Drive we could easily collect 30 to 50 TONS of food!

#### Scouting is Helping Others in Need.

This year please consider the importance of helping **more** of the hungry in our community. Boys who handed out 10 bags last year could increase to 50 bags this year.

Please contact Joan and Ron to secure the territories that you wish to collect in. We don't want to be collecting twice in the same neighborhoods, when

**there is so much other area to cover.** Unlike last year, attention will be paid to working as many areas as possible and not just around the homes of scouts.

Plastic bags, sample of bag notes, and a list of pantries that will be open on February 10 and maps for getting to these pantries will also be at the council office. Your unit is free to select any pantry for their donation of food but they must make their own arrangement if they choose a pantry not on the list.

#### **Need a service Project?**

After the food drive many of the units could help stocking the shelves in the food banks. This is an excellent additional community project.

#### www.snapfish.com

This is soooo easy. Register online and **Snapfish** sends you film mailers for your rolls of film. You send in your roll(s) of film to be processed (they pay for

postage). Then they load your pictures into an online album and send you a set of prints on Kodak paper for \$1.69 total. Advertisers pay for everything else. I have been using them for several months and they are great. The prints are very high quality. The pictures online can be reordered or downloaded, so you can share your troop pictures with others or copy them to put on a web page without having to scan them. All you pay is \$1.69 per roll for shipping & handling. The online advertisers pay the rest. Up to 24 rolls developed free every 12 months! I can youch for this site!
