Tour Permits and Youth Protection

Effective January 2003 both the local tour permit and the national tour permit application will include a requirement that at least one adult present during the event or activity must have completed the BSA Youth **Protection Training.** The national tour permit will continue to include the requirement that all registered adults must have completed the BSA Youth Protection Training for participation in a nationally sponsored event or activity.

National tour permit applications are required to be

submitted for tours or trips 500 miles or over, one way. For tours and trips around and outside of the Midlands area (under 500 miles one-way), a local tour is required. Most short, in-town den trips for a few hours do not require a tour permit; however, it is recommended that dens and troops obtain permission slips from parents.



Indian Waters Council has established that Youth Protection must renewed every two (2) years. Check your Youth Protection cards to see if they have expired. Adults must have taken the full 90-minute YPT after January 2001 to be able to take a troop, crew, or den on an outing.

Youth Protection Training may be arranged by calling Joan Janoch at 345-5700. There will be a YPT before Roundtable in February.

The next segments to open will be near Oconee State Park and in the Jocassee Gorges between Table Rock and Keowee-Toxaway State Park).







They receive summaries of **FeederWatch** data and other findings published in the Lab's quarterly newsletter, *Birdscope*. A \$15 fee helps cover the cost of materials and data analysis.
